

Quarterly Notice to Customers Regarding Uranium MCL Violation

Dear Customer,

We are providing this quarterly update regarding the uranium maximum contaminant level (MCL) violation in our drinking water system. We continue to work toward returning the system to compliance and keeping customers informed as we evaluate and implement corrective actions.

What We Are Doing

We are continuing to work on a blending program using Well 10 and Well 1. The goal of the blending program is to combine water from Well 10 with water from Well 1 in a way that lowers the uranium level in the blended water below the MCL before it is delivered to customers.

Testing is underway to determine whether blending Well 10 with Well 1 can consistently produce water below the uranium MCL. Once the testing results are received and reviewed, we will have more information about whether the blending program can be used as a long-term compliance solution.

If testing shows that blending Well 10 with Well 1 cannot consistently reduce uranium below the MCL, we may be required to pursue another long-term source of water, which could include drilling a new well.

What Customers Should Know

This is not an immediate emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately.

You do not need to use an alternative water supply at this time unless you have been advised to do so by your health care provider or by the regulatory agency. Customers with specific health concerns may wish to consult their health care provider.

We expect to know more after the current testing results are received and evaluated. At that time, we will update customers on whether the blending program is expected to bring the system back into compliance or whether another solution, such as drilling a new well, will be necessary.
